Heyn moves, supported by Bair, to approve the Agenda as presented. Ayes – All. Nays – None. Motion Carried. Rankin – Excused.

NANCY CALL – SENIOR RESOURCES: Annual report distributed; summary of services provided by Senior Resources. Seeking support of the millage renewal in August.

PUBLIC COMMENT: None

PUBLIC HEARING – SCOTT VARIANCE REQUEST:

French moves, supported by Cook to open the Public Hearing. Ayes – All. Nays – None. Motion Carried. Rankin – Excused.

ZA Kirk shares addition plans and explains that the proposed three story garage addition exceeds the height allowance; the first story will be at the basement level which will cause the 2nd and 3rd story to look like two stories when viewed from the street. ZA Kirk recommends approval of the variance. President Flynn calls for any opposing views – none received.

French moves, supported by Heyn, to approve the zoning variance requested for the garage addition at the Scott residence as presented. Ayes – French, Heyn, Misner, Bair, Cook, Flynn. Nays – None. Motion Carried. Rankin – Excused.

Heyn moves, supported by French, to close the Public Hearing. Ayes – All. Nays – None. Motion Carried. Rankin – Excused.

ZA Kirk gives detailed summary of the three proposed ordinances and shares that Public Hearing was held at the last Planning Commission meeting; a recommendation from the Planning Commission by Resolution to approve all three ordinance was presented.

- 2) Ordinance No. 2020-04 Steep Slope Protection Overlay Ordinance. Misner moves, supported by French, to adopt Ordinance No. 2020-04 Steep Slope Protection Overlay Ordinance as presented. Ayes Bair, Hayn, Cook, French, Misner, Flynn. Nays None. Motion Carried. Rankin Excused.
- 3) Ordinance No. 2020-05 US-31 Corridor Overlay Ordinance. French moves, supported by Heyn, to adopt Ordinance No. 2020-05 US-31 Corridor Overlay Ordinance as presented. Ayes Cook, Bair, Heyn, French, Flynn. Nays None. Misner Abstains. Rankin Excused.

Ken Mlcek, Fleis & VandenBrink, gave an update on the MDOT and USDA projects and their coordinated efforts. Tank painting is scheduled for July 20th, the North Street portion of the project late August or early September. Additionally, the MDNR Passport Grant monies for the Academy Park Project have become available, therefore, project will resume.

4) USDA Draw No. 2 – Total Estimate of Funds Needed For 30-Day Period Commencing June 2020, with supporting documents, \$256,871.92. French moves, supported by Heyn, to approve Draw No.2 for the USDA Water Project in the amount of \$256,871.92. Ayes – French, Heyn, Cook, Bair, Misner, Flynn. Nays – None. Motion Carried. Rankin – Excused.

Ken Mlcek shares that the water main and water meter portion of the USDA Project needed larger size pipe at River Street and US 31 at a cost of \$6,000.00 and there was a water main break at South Street and US 31 at a cost of \$3,073.00 prompting the change order to be paid out of the contingency amount of project.

- 5) Change Order No. 2 for Contract No. 1: French moves, supported by Cook, to approve Change Order No. 2 for Contract No. 1, Engineer Project No. 841370, in the amount of \$9,073.00. Ayes Misner, French, Bair, Cook, Heyn, Flynn. Nays None. Motion Carried. Rankin Excused.
